

At the recent meeting of The Women's Fellowship a topic of discussion was the difficulty of circulating village news now that we do not have our own parish news letter.

We considered the matter at some length and it was decided that The Women's Fellowship would like to produce a village News Letter to be published monthly. Any events taking place in, or concerning Soulbury, including Liscombe, Hollingdon and Chelmscote, will be included and it is hoped to be able to insert items of interest such as births, engagements, etc. There may also be room for short letters on matters of general interest. The venture will run for a six month experimental period in the first place but it is hoped that it will be so successful that it can become a permanent feature of our village life. This will, of course, depend on the amount of support we receive both with regard to 'copy' for the news letter and in the size of the readership we achieve.
