It is generally believed that mistletoe is a disappearing species in Britain. To discover if this is true, a national survey is being conducted by the Botanical Society of the British Isles, and Plantlife. The last survey over 30 years ago had few records of mistletoe in North Bucks. As Mistletoe is a parasite on the trees where it grows, it is much easier to see in winter when the leaves are off host trees. If you have seen mistletoe growing locally, or know where it grows, please let Liz Miller know and she will pass the information on to the Society, who will be pleased to receive it.
