

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the recent Council meeting discussion was held on the newly sited concrete posts on The Green. It was agreed that they were placed rather too close together and would look less offensive if painted. A site meeting was to be arranged. The turning into The Green off the main road has also been called a hazard but, suggestions of reflective posts on each corner were not felt to be suitable. Further advice from County Highways would be sought to make the junction safer.

Councillor Liz Miller reported that applications were in for grants to lay a tarmac area on the children's playground. It was agreed that she would also approach Bucks Playing Fields Association for assistance as well. She was determined that the play area should be ready for the summer.

The chairman Mr Alf Peacock was anxious that something should be done to offer village youngsters activities outside the village, as there was nothing for them to do here. Transport could be arranged to Aylesbury occasionally or on a regular basis if parents would get together. If anyone is interested please contact Alf Peacock 270541.

NANCY MERCY 1924 – 2003

We were sorry to hear of the death of Mrs Nancy Mercy. We send our condolences to all the family. Her funeral was held in the church on Tuesday march 18th at 1.45pm. Mrs Mercy had lived in the village for 60 years and was well known by all the older residents of the village and by other local old families.

The church was full of mourners – family members, relatives and friends. The committal took place at Old Linslade Cemetery where Nancy was buried next to her husband.

The service was conducted by the Rev. Peter Lymbery. The family wish to thank everyone who attended the church and those who came to join with them in the Club Room afterwards to offer their condolences and partake of a little refreshment.

Nancy Grace Chappell was born in Stewkley, a daughter for Harry and Violet and a sister to Joan. She attended the local Church of England school in Stewkley and only came to Soulbury to Bowden Farm when she married Bob Mercy in 1943. They had three daughters Jean. Margaret, and Sally, and eventually three sons in law, 7 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren, many of whom live locally and are well known. In the 1970's Nancy and Bob moved from Wellmead farm to their bungalow which was their home till recently. Very sadly

Bob died in 1988 a few years after they had celebrated in fine style their Ruby Wedding Anniversary in 1983. Nancy loved the farming life and her large family. She also enjoyed playing darts and dominoes and attending agricultural shows where she and Bob, followed by daughter, Margaret and husband Lawrence and more lately their son Andrew, have all made a name for themselves showing cattle.
