There has been much speculation, rumour and gossip as to what is happening to the Millennium Green. It is hoped that these can be addressed so that you are aware of the facts and can rest easy that there will not suddenly be a mass building program taking place. The Millennium Green was not established 10 years ago to be turned into a housing estate when things got tough. The Trust is solvent, the goals and aspirations of the existing trustees have not changed, we wish for it to remain for the purpose for which it was created and that was an open area in our community for all to enjoy and co-exist with the existing wildlife that it enjoys.

However in order for this to happen we do need a little more hands on help from those within our community. We are not asking for anyone to give more than they are able or willing to give, but help is needed with grass cutting (as we use a ride on mower this would have to be persons 18 or older) and the pathways to be kept clear of overhanging vegetation. What would be nice is to know that when volunteers are needed that there are some within the parish that will help small work parties which as a group can get a lot done, and these work parties are about 4 times a year. The trust does appreciate the help that is given by the same few who when asked will help if able to. As has been mentioned several times both in the LBO and Newsletter we are looking for 2 new trustees and 1 secretary to enable the Millennium Green to carry on unchanged. Ideally the existing trustees do not want to consider alternative means to secure the Millennium Greens future. Easter Sunday was a very special day for the Bonsor family from Liscombe House. Sir Nicholas and Lady Bonsor hosted a family party for the baptism of their first grandchild Cosmo James Bonsor, born on 15th December 2007. Cosmo, although only three months old, was beautifully behaved and charmed everyone with his blue eyes and his sweet alert little face. He lay in the arms of his young mother, dressed in a white christening robe, fearlessly enduring the cold water poured onto his head at the font, seemingly considering it to be a perfectly normal occurrence. Dear Resident of Soulbury,

Help save All Saints Church

As trustees of the Friends of Soulbury church we are sending this letter to all the residents of the village because we need your help and support to raise funds for <u>your</u> church.

Perhaps you do not use the Church very often – maybe not at all. But even if you never come to a service the Church is an important part of the village scene which makes an impressive and attractive contribution to our landscape. Soulbury without its church just wouldn't be Soulbury.

The building is loved by many but keeping it standing and watertight is a significant financial burden for a small village.

In1994 the village faced the daunting prospect of having to find nearly £200,000 to cover essential repairs which reflected a lack of proper maintenance that went back many years. This charity, the Friends of Soulbury Church was formed to raise funds to cover these urgent costs. The charity is separate from the Church of England and Parish Church Council so the costs of maintaining the church are ring fenced from the day to day running costs of the parish. We hoped this would make it easier for those of different religious persuasions – or none – to support the charity.

To our surprise we raised the funds needed to keep the church going. But the problem continues and the church architect has identified more work which, with fees are budgeted to cost around £112,000.

Our aim

To keep the building going regular and proper maintenance is required together with a programme of appropriate restoration. To achieve this we need to ensure a steady

and regular flow of funds. This can be done through fund raising events in the village and, we hope, through regular planned giving.

Fund raising.

We want to revitalize this charity – bring in new blood and new ideas. Fund raising can be fun. The last big push in the late '90s brought the village together in a special way. So our first call is for volunteers to help us run the charity and raise funds. We will be inviting the whole village to an open meeting in the church soon. Please try and attend so we can tell you more of our restoration and fund raising plans.

Planned giving.

This can make a significant contribution as it enables the charity to set annual budgets and, if you are tax payer, helps us recover tax. We are aiming to establish a system of voluntary "tithes". There are 300 households in Soulbury. We want to raise an <u>average</u> of £25 per annum per household – 50p per week. That would give us a fixed yearly income of £7,500.

That £7,500 is actually worth more than that to us. We can reclaim basic rate tax which will increase this sum to £9,375. For major work a contribution by the village of £9,375 is likely to be matched several times over by grant aid that is available which could increase that sum to around £50,000 - well on the way to cover the costs.

What next.

Please let us know if you are interested in getting more involved with the Friends. To help you can complete the enclosed form which an also be downloaded from the village website (www.soulbury.org) and return it to one of the trustees or leave it at the church.

If you can contribute to our voluntary tithe then please complete the standing order form. We will do the rest. £25 per household per year average is our target but we will be grateful for all donations whatever the size.
