CHURCH NEWS

The Priest-in-charge of All saints and the PCC have been lucky enough to receive an acceptance for their request for a Grant from English heritage. This is very good news. It is a lengthy and complicated process. It was undertaken because the Church is in need of expensive and extensive repairs. It is a beautiful ancient building which dominates the village in a spectacular way and like all old buildings in requires constant maintenance, care and repair. Even though many people in the village do not worship there regularly, the Church seems to be recognized and appreciated as part of the history and core of village life, and most people feel strongly that it is worth fighting to preserve our heritage. The basic financial facts are that English Heritage have estimated that we need to spend in excess of £200,000; the Grant will cover approximately £109,000 of that amount.

So there is a lot of work to be done, and a huge challenge to raise the difference. If anybody in the village would like to get involved in any way, no matter how small or insignificant it may seem, that help would be accepted with delight and gratitude... Please get in touch with any members of the PCC or Churchwardens whose names are on the board outside the Church.

The Parochial Church Council is holding its Annual General Meeting in the church on Wednesday April 1st at 6.30pm. Everyone is welcome to attend. If you have suggestions or comments you would like to make about the proposed building repairs or any other views you would like to express about the life of the Church, do come along.

EVENT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE WINSLOW –SATURDAY 25TH APRIL

One of the issues causing concern for the community of Buckingham South was the anti-social behaviour of youths in the area. It was therefore taken on as a priority task for the Neighbourhood Action Group. One of the actions considered was increased engagement with these very youths.

To this end PCSO Wendy Taylor considered putting on an event that would show the opportunities available for the young people of today, to include career opportunities, things to do in spare/free time which include the volunteering sector. Also included, and equally important, will be the ways to access of the activities presented. Wendy put this suggestion to **the NAG, who agreed it would be an excellent idea. Freda Ackroyd, the ‘Getting Closer to Communities’ representative** on the Buckingham South East NAG, contacted her colleagues at Aylesbury Vale District Council and Bucks County Council who also agreed the idea was excellent.

We now have a huge event for which we have been given the entire site at the Winslow Centre, Park Road, Winslow for the day

- 70 groups/clubs/companies have all pledged their support for the day
- local people with a huge array of expertise have offered their support
- young people of the area are involved with the organisation.

The following careers will be represented:

All rural trades including agricultural engineering, thatching, hedgelaying, farriery, building, carpentry, hospitality, catering, butchery. Army, Navy and Air Force, Fire, Paramedic, Police. Hair, make-up, nails. Childcare.

The event is to be named by the young people at which the event is aimed via a competition for a poster to advertise the event. This is being run through schools and youth clubs.

The young people will be collected and returned to their villages by Youth Bus who will co-ordinate the journeys required. However, Winslow and Furze Down Schools have supported the event by allowing their car parking area to be used on a ‘park and walk’ basis. **This is to reduce the traffic using the narrow roads to the Winslow Centre as there will no parking on site that day, except for those holding Disabled badges.**

Those involved with the organisation are working towards this becoming an annual event.
