Weight Restrictions in Soulbury: There was an impressive attendance at the meeting with the Assistant County Engineer, but we doubt whether anyone in Soulbury found much comfort in the proceedings. Apart from agreeing to consider the effect of one sign at Water Eaton Mr. Whitehouse made no concession to the disquiet expressed by all the speakers from the floor and by the Parish Councillors. Mr. Whitehouse has stated that at some unspecified future date a census will be taken to compare traffic numbers with those before the signs were erected but he clearly did not accept the universally stated opinion that there had been a considerable and unacceptable increase in the volume of heavy vehicles since the new measures have been in force.

We are sure that Soulbury will not be willing to let the matter rest here until 1985 or whatever later date the new roads are commenced, not to mention completed.

Friends of the Vale of Aylesbury: This group are planning a very ambitious Chronicle of the Villages of the Vale of Aylesbury and require one or more persons in the Soulbury area who will be prepared to help in the compilation of this modern Domesday Book by supplying data about Soulbury and its surrounding hamlets.

Mrs. Jean Brymer (Soulbury 315) has the correspondence about this and will be pleased to show it to anyone who is interested in helping with this project.

Soulbury Clubroom: The Clubroom Committee point out that the parking area in front of the Clubroom is for persons using the Clubroom and must not be used as a car park.

Playground: The final fencing of the Playground should be in place in the next two weeks and the top half of the ground will be close mown by the time we go to press, so that the children can play there as soon as these two operations are complete.
