TAP DANCING

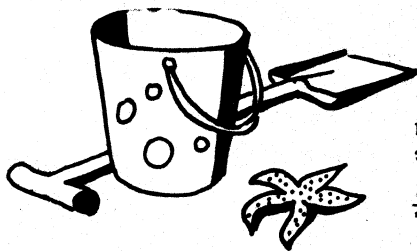
