In conjunction with the Neighbourhood Watch Schemes of both Soulbury and Stewkley it is intended to hold a special CRIME PREVENTION and FUN DAY at St Michaels School in Stewkley. Together with three Co-ordinators from Soulbury and three from Stewkley the planning has begun. So I want you all to grab hold of your calenders and get that date marked in now.



The idea of the day is to enhance your knowledge of Crime Prevention, especially that which is pertinent to both villages but at the same time to enjoy the day and perhaps make some money for local charities and organisations. But instead of Police Officers lecturing to you, you yourselves will be instructing each other and helping each other in crime awareness. The theme of the day will be based on the Government campaign of "Crime-Together We Can Crack It", the together being the two villages that I cover. Organisations from both villages will be doing stalls on various themes of Crime Prevention. So far we have over twenty groups taking part.-along side those stalls they will also be running cake stalls, tombola, games, crafts etc etc. Along with yourselves we have managed to get hold of a few professionals who will be coming out on the day. We have two alarm companies displaying their wares, the Eastern Electricity Board with security lighting, there will be a demonstration car fitted out with various types of burglar alarms and a company which security mark cars will be there marking cars on the day for under £5. Last but not least Thames Valley Police will have their "Post Code It" caravan and their Exhibition caravan. The Neighbourhood Schemes will be doing their own stall, and what we require is each Co-ordinator to make a list of exactly the area they cover, number of houses, number of participants etc, and that way two large maps can be made showing exactly the coverage there is and where there are gaps perhaps signing up a few new Co-ordinators. Now if you wish to take part in this worthwhile project, which I hasten to add may put the Ideal Home Exhibition to shame, or you wish to help in anyway then could you contact either myself, the usual place, via Aylesbury Police Station, or one of the following Co-ordinators Mrs Conquest, 384, Mrs Norman, 483 or Mr Warren, 630.
