At the recent Parish Council meeting the Chairman and Councillors were pleased to welcome P.C. Trendell, who has shown some enthusiasm in re-vitalising the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. More of this will be heard next month. There followed a long discussion on traffic, and now that the signs are finally positioned, P.C. Trendell has promised to follow up any report that he receives on over-weight (but under 14 feet in height) vehicles going through the restricted area. If anyone would make a written statement giving the vehicle registration number, date and time, and any other details which might be relevant including your own name and address and post it to Aylesbury Police Station or to P.C. Trendell at 2 Sycamore Close, Stewkley, it will be dealt with. It was also agreed that now the Leighton Linslade Southern Bypass is under way the Parish Council will be pressing for a lower weight limit throughout the village to be timed to coincide with the completion * * On planning matters the public were urged to note any complaints of disturbance, unsightliness, or hazardous egress or access at the Hollingdon Depot site on the Stewkley Road, especially relating to the Mobile Units for temporary use, and to send these to the Chief Planning Officer, at Aylesbury Vale District Council. The Public Inquiry over the application for the use of Brookfield Wood, Great Brickhill for "Tactical Sports" (War Games) will take place during 7th - 10th August 1990 at High Ash Combined School, Pound Hill, Great Brickhill, commencing at 10.00 a.m. daily.
