PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting on 21st July the Chairman, Mr Alf Peacock, reported from the Road Safety Consultative Group Meeting in June. He had requested traffic surveys be carried out on all three roads into Soulbury. He also learnt that it is unlikely that the Castle Hill Bridge in Wing would be repaired for at least five years so the extra weight lorries would be continuing to use the route through Soulbury all that time. This was not a satisfactory situation for Soulbury or Stewkley, and they would again press for an earlier funding for the repair.

M.P. Mr John Biercow had responded to the council's letter regarding the weight limit of 17 tonnes through The Green, and had expressed a willingness to help. He and the Parish Council would be seeking an early implementation of a 7.5 tonne limit.

An application had been received from Mr T Taylor to extend the date for excavations at Rislip Farm for a further two years. They would now be continuing until December 1999.

There was further discussion about the screening of Hollingdon Depot and Mrs Liz Miller agreed to try to make progress there.

Mr Peacock felt that the various firms and work places in Soulbury ought to receive a Newsletter, as this might help to engender a feeling of "community" and helping each other and would keep firms in touch with village activities. He volunteered to deliver these if Mr Brazier would kindly duplicate some extras.

The revised Mobile Library timetable has been received, and we note that it will now call in Soulbury at Stewkley Road on Mondays at 2:35-2:50. However it was felt that the Bus Stop is not a satisfactory stopping place for villagers who use the service, and a representation should be made. If anyone would like to comment please telephone Mr Handley on 01280 813229.

The next Parish Council meeting was arranged for September 15th.


