MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS

Official progress is slow, as everyone knows who has purchased a house. Legal details take an age to complete but we are getting there. Planning permission has been

granted; the Charity Commissioners_are considering the application to form a Charitable Trust and should give us the go ahead this week; and we have a bank account! Any cheques can now be made out to "Soulbury Millennium Green Trust". The trustees very much enjoyed the company of those who attended the awareness evening, and hope to see those members of the village who couldn't make it over the next few weeks.

Offers of help have been very encouraging. So far all these different ways of helping have been offered:-

volunteer driver and digger for the pond, volunteers hay making, tent erection and path clearing, sponsors for individual trees, bat and bird boxes, covenants, sponsor for the pedestrian entrance gate, sponsor towards the cost of fencing, volunteer to set the gates in to the field, volunteer driver and grass cutter.

A volunteer workers list has been started and is being kept by Liz Miller. If you would like to add your name to it there will be lots of different activities to interest you over the next eighteen months or so. The first stage of work will include dredging out the pond and the ditches and wet areas. This should be happening in early September. The gates will be hung also quite soon, and the grass will continue to be mown to help reduce the tussocks. (We could do with some help here as it needs some quite substantial cutters to cope with the tough grasses, any offers?) Also, once cut the grass must be removed from the surface which we have been doing with hay rakes. Whilst the paper work is being completed the Green is being surveyed for its present wildlife interest. Members of Milton Keynes Natural History Society, and Buckinghamshire's Recorders for Insects and Flowers and Grasses have visited the site. Neighbours to the Green may have seen the bright light that was being used to attract moths one warm night recently. Our Millennium Green may well be the site for the first record in North Buckinghamshire of at least one or even two insects! What fame!

ALPHA IS COMING TO SOULBURY!

Tuesday 15th September is the day that Alpha comes to Soulbury. Alpha is a series of videos each followed by a short discussion exploring the major questions of life. It is designed for people who want to know the truth about Jesus Christ. Was he just a good man? So why did he claim to be perfect? Did he claim to be God? What does that mean to me? 
