Parish Council News

At the recent meeting Mrs. Jackie Ridley was warmly welcomed onto the Parish Council. The Chairman had received several letters concerning roads and traffic, and the safety of pedestrians. The Councils view was to deal with some of the issues where possible itself but to pass the comments and worries of the public onto the Highways Department of the County Council to keep them constantly aware of Soulbury's need for a by-pass.

Liscombe Park had written to say that the lorries carrying soil for the reinstatement of the tank field had ceased, as there is an enforcement order on that activity, they felt that they had been the scape-goat for all the blame of the heavy lorries going through Soulbury when only a small proportion were actually visiting Liscombe. Mr Darvill re iterated a welcome to all parties or anyone concerned over his activities to go up to Liscombe Park to see for themselves what is happening. He also hoped that more members of the Council and Soulbury Villagers would join in the by pass action group.

It is hoped that the County Council Officers will be holding a traffic and roads meeting soon concerning the local villages, and that Soulbury will be able to be represented in large numbers there. The date will be announced.

There was a written request from a local resident to remind those who like to burn rubbish, and who particularly use long slow-burning bonfires, that the smell can travel a long way in the slow moving air, of course on warm summer days and evenings house windows and doors are left open so the smoke can be very offensive. If burning waste please consider your neighbours and try to do it when the wind is in the right direction.

Bucks County Council announced a "new" bus service to operate on Saturdays commencing 25th July. It will be run by Red Rose Travel on the number 53 route (not 59). Supported by the Rural Bus Service Grant.

Thanks to TJC for the loan of the equipment, which helped to speed up things and also to Ian Parrott for operating and providing equipment. Special thanks to Jim for masterminding the work. A few gullies and it will be finished.

Our M.P. John Bercow was passing through the village on the Saturday afternoon and encouraged the volunteers by calling into the churchyard to see the work inprogress. He showed considerable interest and also listened to what we had to say about local traffic and farming matters.

The Friends of Soulbury Church now have sufficient funds in hand to finance the drainage and to pay off the money retained against the contractor's bill, but still need to raise some £6000 for the restoration of the bells. Any offers of additional financial help or fund raising activities would be appreciated.

To this end, Tony Saint and his staff together with the musical talent of Chris Jones, Sue Taylor and team will be putting on a BBQ and Musical Evening at the Boot on Sunday 29th August. Tickets available from the Boot at £7.50 per head.

Soulbury Millennium Green

We hope to see the Millennium Sculpture installed in the next two weeks. Work is progressing on the Carlow stone (not Kilkenny) design and is at this moment being polished. On Saturday 7th August and Sunday 8th August we would like a work party to help on the amphitheatre. We are a bit desperate for volunteers so if you could possibly come and help, and view the sculpture at the same time, we would be delighted to see you from 10 - 12.30 and 2 - 4.20pm.


