PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting held on 19th July, Councillor Victor Wright was unanimously elected Chairman and Councillor Morris Cross, Vice Chairman.

A vote of thanks was given to Councillor Peacock, the retiring Chairman, for his services to both the Council and the village.

Permission has been granted for the erection of a 17.5 metre mast alongside the A4146, on condition that should the mast be no longer required it will be removed within 3 months.

The Children's Playground has been temporarily closed to allow the maintenance of equipment.

Grass Cutting: Councillor Cross reported that he was very grateful that one lady volunteer had contacted him to help with grass cutting.

Correspondence has been received concerning:

Road Closure: The B4032 Soulbury to Stewkley road is to be closed from the 9th to the 12th August inclusive for resurfacing.

Bucks County Show: The show will be held at Weedon Park on 2nd September.

A donation to the retirement fund for Rev Norman Cotton was agreed.

Millennium Green: It was agreed that the Clerk should check the Trust's deeds as to whether or not a storage shed and toilets could be built on the Green.

It was reported that complaints had been received concerning three cars that have been parked permanently by the churchyard. The Clerk was asked to contact the County Council to check ownership of the land.

SID (Speed Indicator Device): The councillors agreed that SID will be borrowed for up to one week. Volunteers are needed to man SID- instructions on how to operate it will be given. 
