In December 1623 the great priest-poet John Donne was struck down with a mysterious illness and wrote 23 meditations called Devotions upon Emergent Occasions. Number XVII includes the immortal phrases: "No man is an island, intire of it selfe" and "for whom the bell tolls". Donne speaks of feeling part of all humanity, irrespective of nationality or race and it seems very apt at such times as we are living in now, when unscrupulous individuals and groups seek to use difference to fracture our communities and set people against each other for their own gain. Donne again: "any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in Mankind".

W.I. NEWS: The monthly meeting for July was held in the parish hall with Jean Housley presiding. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed and matters arising dealt with. Members were reminded of the barbecue to be held at the home of Gay Henrick in August. It was then time for some of our talented members to show off examples of their many skills. These included millinery, patchwork, decorative bow making, a simple table runner and the lovely effects one can achieve knitting with specialist yarns, as well as a simple way to make a flower holder. What a wonderful selection of skills!

There is no meeting in August, so our next meeting is on Tuesday September 13th when the speaker will be Peter Barrett whose topic will be "The Story of Punch and Judy". Our outing to Northampton in July was very well attended. We first visited 78 Derngate, a house once owned by W.J. Bassett-Lowke, and whose interior was redesigned by Charles Rennie Mackintosh. Although the house has had several other uses since the owners moved out in the mid 1920s, many of the original features have been preserved. After a delicious lunch provided by the staff at the house, we moved on to the Shoe Museum. Here over 1500 pairs of shoes were displayed ranging from early Roman sandals to the very latest in footwear. A most enjoyable and entertaining day, appreciated by everyone. Grateful thanks to Chris Bryant for arranging the trip.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS: Report of Soulbury Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 18th July in the Parish Hall with in excess of thirty parishioners present.

The Chairman opened the meeting by expressing his anger and disappointment at the comments that had been aimed at him and the Council. Some of which had been libellous as they were in the public domain i.e. on Facebook. He requested that the meeting be conducted in a civilised manner.

Apologies received from Mr. M Cross. The minutes of the last meeting were approved subject to one correction, that of Wendy Taylor's surname.

Finances: The Clerk reported the receipt on £1782 VAT refund. Regular payments were approved with further payments for grass cutting.

Planning Applications: Clover Hill Cottage, approval of matters relating to appearance, landscaping layout, scale and demolition of existing dwelling and erection of 4 bedroom house. No objection.

Hillcroft Industrial estate, The Wickets approval of previous plan as 2007. Approved

Dean Farm Lane, Outline planning permission and change of use, for two dwellings. The Council abstained from making a decision as too many factors involved. Determination left to AVDC.

The Boot Field, Outline planning for 6 dwellings. There were several objections from parishioners who were unaware of this application. The implication of 6 houses overlooking the village were emphasised by the number of objectors at the meeting. After much discussion and debate the Parish Council were obliged to oppose the application.

The Children's Playground: It had been noted that the contractors of the two houses being built in Mount Pleasant were to provide the new parking spaces as soon as possible. Thereby eliminating the need for parking on the playground, this was after the gate was forcibly removed by one or more residents.

Report of district and county councillors: Mrs Janet Blake reported that once more funding has been cut and three divisions of highways have gone. The new incinerator at Calvert is to open on July 22nd. Bucks County Council is £53million in the red. The setting up of unitary authorities is under discussion, but AVDC would prefer to be on its own as local accountability and quality of service are important. The Vale of Aylesbury local plan has to be in place by 2017. The Vale needs another 21,000 houses in the next five years

Neighbourhood Plan: A speaker from Stewkley will be invited to the next meeting to talk at length about this.
