PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

A planning appeal has been submitted for the Stewkley Road site again. The appeal reference number is APP/J0405/A/95/251731 site OS1234 Stewkley Road, Soulbury. It is lodged against the refused permission for four dwellings to be erected, (although the plans did leave room for several more had the permission been granted). The Parish Council would like to urge all villagers who are concerned about such issues to act now and unite to the Department of the Environment by Tuesday, 5th December. The main points on which the appeal should be dismissed are that the proposed development represents an extension of the village beyond its defined boundaries. The developers claim that the site is bounded by building on three sides, but Ivy Cottage does not constitute a development and is still an isolated dwelling in the open countryside. There is no proven need for such a development in the village and it would intrude on the privacy of local residents. The open field site, which used to be grazed by sheep and horses, offers extended views across the countryside to all those situated on the westside of the Green, and is highlighted in the Village Conservation Area. The Parish Council also emphasise their support for the decision of the Inspector who determined the 1992 Appeal. The address to which to unite is:- Dept. of the Environment, Room No. 12/16, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol, BS2 9DJ.

Aylesbury Vale District Council has been made aware of further restrictions on supplying villages with skips. It is illegal to site the skips in locations 'on or adjacent to the highway'. If we are to stand a chance of keeping the skip services we must offer a site which would be acceptable, for instance:- a public house car park with written authority for a periodic skip from the owners, or a recreation ground car park, church hall car park or similar area. The Parish Council are investigating some possibilities.

The footpath in front of Andrews Close has eventually been the subject of some agreement. Pending the County Council instating a short piece of new path, the old footway will be dug up, levelled and grassed over. As there is still paper work to be completed on this however, it will probably still be some time before all this is achieved.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday 18th December.

The Work

We have suffered a setback in that when the lead on the South Aisle was receiving attention it was discovered that the wooden beams running along the outside edge of the roof had almost disintegrated. The additional cost of this repair could be £5,000, but we believe that we have funds to cover 30% of this, if English Heritage will provide the 70% which was within their original budget. It does, however, mean a Christmas instead of mid-November finish to Phase 1.

Planning for work to be carried out in 1996 and 1997 is now in hand. Details will be in the Friends' First Annual Report to be published in February 1996.
