PARISH NEWS

The next Parish Council meeting is on 20th December. The date of the January meeting is to be confirmed and will be advertised on the Parish Hall notice board.

Parish Hall: We are now in the process of obtaining quotations for decorating the inside of the hall, along with a few refurbishments.

The Parish Plan is in the process of being updated. When this has been done, we will display the "Summary of Action Plans" on the Parish Hall notice board. When the Parish Plan questionnaire was analysed, the result to the question whether we would like to see a Parish Design Statement was positive, with at least 70% of respondents saying they would like to see one created. In view of the information from District Council (see below) it is evident that we require an active working group to put this in place, in order that the information is documented. For instance, this information will include the type, style, quantity of building, if any, that residents of Soulbury Parish want. Perhaps from the 70% who want a Parish Design Statement, or indeed any other persons, a working group can be formed. It is better to have more people than less for this sort of group. With planning decisions now being handed back to local councils, the District Council will be writing to every town and parish council asking them exactly what they think they need from AVDC in the way of housing stock. They will be relying on Parish Plans and asking villages to bring their Parish Plans up to date, as these will be used as a guide and reference.

Flooding in Stewkley Road: We are pleased to report that Highways have now resolved this issue.

Allotments: We are in the process of clearing some dense overgrowth, brambles and trees, from a neglected area of the allotments in order to fulfil the current waiting list, after which there will be no further allotments available. CHURCH NEWS

We wish you all a very Happy Christmas and hope to see you at some of our services over the holiday season. I would like to draw your attention to the Joint Benefice Service on Boxing Day January 26th at Aston Abbots at 10 o'clock. It would be nice if we had a good turn-out from Soulbury, though I realise you may be suffering from over indulgence after Christmas and a too full programme of activities!

Advent Course: The Benefice is putting on a course over the 4 weeks of Advent to which everyone is invited. If you cannot make all of the dates, this does not matter. Just come to as many as you can. We shall be looking at four of the Old Testament books about prophets, dates are as follows:

1st week : Thursday November 25th at Wing church All Saints' at 7.45pm for an 8 o'clock start. The Rev. Derek Witchell will be leading us through Micah.

2nd week : Wednesday December 1st at Soulbury Parish Hall at the same time. The Rev. Ian Ogilvie will take the session on Amos.

3rd week : Wednesday December 8th at Stewkley Methodist Hall at 7.45pm for 8pm start. The Rev. Jim Gorringer will take us through Hosea.

4th week : Wednesday December 15th at Cheddington Church at 7.45pm for 8pm start. The Rev. Robert Wright will do Elijah.

Burials: Over the last few weeks we have sadly had two more deaths. On Tuesday September 28th Mrs Sheila Mary Belsham was buried in All Saints' churchyard after a service in the Roman Catholic Church of the Sacred Heart in Leighton Buzzard. Sheila was a devout Christian and was a regular churchgoer here at All Saints' for many years. Brought up as a Catholic, for the last years of her life she went back to her roots and attended mass at the Sacred Heart Church every week. She had lived in Soulbury since the 1970s and was a familiar sight around the village walking her dogs, lately, of course, she had two little daschunds Rosie and Florrie, both of whom have now died, Rosie of a broken heart. Sheila was not an easy person to get to know well, but she had a great sense of humour, a great sympathy for the poor of the world and I do miss her very much, as she was a very good neighbour to me.

On November 18th, Mrs Iris Mary Ayris who had died in Stoke Mandeville Hospital was buried here in All Saints' churchyard. It was a big funeral attended by about 80 people from the surrounding area and by family from all over the country. Iris and her devoted husband Harry had lived up at Liscombe all their married lives where they brought up their four children. Iris came with Harry to our church every Sunday, without fail throughout those many years. When they moved to Wing they continued to attend All Saints church every week, even when Iris became very poorly. People will remember her at the annual Church Fete which used to be held in June, especially if you were after buying a cake, because that's where she always was, in the cake-stall tent. Our heartfelt condolences go out to Harry and his family at this time of mourning. She will be sadly missed by the congregation and all those who knew her in Soulbury.

MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS
