At a recent Women's Fellowship meeting we listened to a most interesting talk by Mrs. Veronica Sankaram about the Domesday Book. Mrs. Sankaram, who spent a good many years helping to translate the Book from the original Latin into English, had made a particular note of some of the passages referring to Buckinghamshire in general and Soulbury in particular. We were fascinated to learn how many mills (water mills of course) there were in the area, and how many hides of land and how many cattle eig were held by various tenants in return for service to the lord of the manor who in return owed protection to his tenants as well as military service to his overlord and ultimately to the king. Nowadays we pay our taxes, cheerfully dr otherwise, and make the protection of the realm the responsibility of the government. But this does not relieve us of the responsibility for our own immediate environment. We need only consider the nine hundred years which separate us from those Domesday inhabitants of Soulbury to realise that we must take our share in ensuring that in another nine hundred years people will still find Soulbury a pleasant place in which to live.
