

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Residents will be pleased and interested to know that proceedures have been started to establish a Bye-Law prohibiting dogs from the Children's playground. More details will be given as progress is made.

After constantly drawing the attention of the Divisional Surveyor to the particularly annoying puddles of water that have been lying in the dip by the Mount Pleasant turn for months, he has finally agreed to inspect the area.

The appeal lodged against the refusal of permission for Tactical Sports (War Games) at Brookfield Woods, Little Brickhill Road, Great Brickhill, will now be made into a Public Appeal. Soulbury Parish Council supported the

objections of Great Brickhill Parish Council. Also on planning, the change of use has been granted for the old Cibié site with landscaping provision, and car parking for at least 80 cars. More applications are still coming in for this area which it seems will probably provide bases for about five or six different activities. * * *
