PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

It was noted at the recent meeting that there are still several footpaths in the area that are not passable or which have unsatisfactory stiles. The clerk agreed to write to the landowners involved, and also to the Bucks Footpaths Officer.

Regarding the future funding of Stockgrove Park, Councillor Luther Brazier considered that any commercialisation of country areas such as Kingswood at Stockgrove Park as specific leisure areas should be opposed, particularly since it appears likely that Bucks County Council will be raising car parking charges on all their parkland areas in the near future. It was agreed that Councillor Brazier would draft a letter to the Chief Executive of Bucks County Council, and that the Clerk would write to Heath and Reach Parish Council to enlist their support for this opposition.

An application had been received to erect a grain store in the middle of the field owned by Denne Farms Ltd opposite Shenstone Acres on the Stewkley Road. The Council strongly opposed the proposal as the building was very large, visually obtrusive in an area of open countryside, and likely to be used for comercial rather than purely agricultural purposes.

Correspondence had been received by the Clerk relating to the budget situation for Bucks County Council. It is clear that there will be a rise in Council Tax above the rate of inflation coupled with reductions in environmental services. There is to be a public meeting held in Aylesbury on Wednesday, 28 January to discuss the issues involved in setting the budget. Details can be obtained from Liz Miller on 270545.

Councillor Maureen Payne (270418) informed the Parish Council that there is to be a public planning meeting on the same day, Wednesday, 28 January 7.30 pm at St Michaels School, Chapel Square, Stewkley to discuss local planning matters.

The next meeting was confirmed for Monday 16 February.


