PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The parish council met on 15th December and 19th January. Among the topics discussed were:

Road Repairs: it was noted that repairs had been made to the Soulbury The Three Locks road. However, concern was expressed that the Soulbury to Linslade road was still in need of attention.

2002/3 Audit: the Clerk reported that the 2002/3 audit of accounts had been completed satisfactorily and that a notice has been placed on the board. A copy of the annual statement can be obtained from the Clerk for £1.

2004/5 Precept: spending council and tax plans requirements for the coming financial year were discussed. It was unanimously agreed that the precept (the amount of tax money from Aylesbury Vale) be fixed at the sum of £9,000 (2003/4 £11,000). This included £3,000 to be spent on the children's playground.

Payment to Church: it was agreed that a cheque for £1,000 should be sent to the church – representing a £500 donation from the parish council and £500 from the volunteers who cut the grass on the village green and verges, and in the allotments and the children's playing fields.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Harley Farm: permission has been granted for the mobile home to be sited at Harley Farm for three years (up to 31st December 2006).

Hollingdon Depot: permission has been granted for no more than 11 coaches and one mini bus to operate from this site. Only repair and maintenance of the 12 vehicles allowed. Concern was expressed that the hedge facing the road had been removed.

Cedar Lodge: it was reported that parishioners had expressed concern about the damage being caused to The Green by the builders working on the Cedar Lodge site. The Clerk was requested to write to the owner.

Mobile Library Service: Buckinghamshire County Council has written stating that as from June 2004 there will be one stopping place in Soulbury at the bus stop on alternate Mondays from 2.20 – 2.35 pm. The Clerk will be writing to urge that the stop in the bungalows lay-by be retained.

School Bus: it was reported that the school bus is now using a different route to get to the village. As a result, it is necessary for the school children to assemble on the opposite side of Stewkely Road. The situation was discussed and the Clerk was asked to write to the County Council to enquire

why the bus was taking a different route.

Allotments: the Clerk reported that of the 24 plots 12 were being rented. Anyone who is interested in renting a plot, total cost £6 per year (£5 rent, £1 water), should contact John Spires, telephone number 01525 370094.

Village Sign: the sign is now ready for installation. The site of the sign was agreed, and also that it should have a brick base and a plaque reading "To commemorate the Golden Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II".
