Dog fouling seems to be on the increase. Owners of dogs allowing this can be reported to the Parish Council; who will take appropriate The Dog Warden at action. Aylesbury Vale Council has been informed.

The Parish Council has reluctantly accepted that Cllr Alf Peacock will not be able to continue as a Parish Councillor for health and other reasons. Thev have already acknowledged his outstanding service to the village during the years he spent on the council particularly as Chairman. They have also placed a seat on The Green as an appreciation of his contribution to the life of the village.

Parish Review

The Parish Council has been advised by Aylesbury Vale District Council that no further action will be taken on the proposal to adjust the boundary between Soulbury and Great Brickhill Parish Councils by following the line of the River Ousel. This would have involved

the transfer of part of Soulbury Parish Council to the Great Brickhill Parish Council, principally Stockgrove Park. reason for this decision is that there is no consensus. particularly from those living in the area, that a change in boundary is desirable. The Parish Council are very pleased with the outcome and would like to thank all those who helped getting together a petition opposing the proposal. They are also grateful to residents Stockgrove Park for their loyalty to the village of Soulbury.
