## OPERATION ACCURIST

Aylesbury Vale District Council and Thames Valley Police are currently running a burglary operation throughout the Vale. The operation is called "Accurist" and has targeted homes in darkness following the clocks turning back and the evenings becoming darker quicker. She was instrumental in the establishment of the Millennium Green, working as secretary and afterwards as Chairman of the Trust, organising all sorts of fund-raising events for the village.

In spite of an unhappy childhood and suffering an horrendous agricultural accident as a young girl, which left her paralysed from the waist down and confined to a wheelchair for over half her life, she always managed to be the most cheerful, humorous and smiling person in any situation.

**She was a painter and had recently repainted The Boot's pub sign, which is now re-installed in its rightful place outside the pub.** She loved animals, dogs and birds particularly, and all wildlife and the natural world. She was clever and had loads of patience and determination, teaching herself to be a whizz on the computer which resulted in designing websites for clients.

She remained fun-loving and lively, accepting and philosophical about her inevitable death right to the end and I **for one shed tears now, as I think of her.** I'm sure everyone will join with me in sending condolences to her dear friend and carer Nan Chadwick and the family in Ascott.

The funeral took place at Milton Keynes Crematorium with donations to Willen Hospice being most welcome.
