For those who have some means of transport a short drive, 30 miles, almost completely on minor roads or lanes can be most enjoyable. We then went via Mentmore to Cheddington, past the apple orchards and so on to Ivinghoe; here we turned towards the Downs and at the foot of the Beacon turned into a road which gives views of the Downs and the lion at Whipsnade. road, overhung with beech trees, leads to Ringshall and to Ashridge Common with its places for picnics and to the Bridgewater Memorial on the right. From here the road goes through quiet fields to Wingrave with its lovely mellow stone church, beautiful warm, red brick houses and pretty village pond and ducks. Home again through Wing and Soulbury, thus completing a ride through remarkably unspoilt countryside.

There must be many other pleasant drives in the area and the Newsletter would like to publish other suggestions for routes to follow. If you have a favourite drive, why not share it with others, both in the Newsletter and by inviting others more elderly and
