



**SAVE THE BRICKHILLS**

We have been asked to give our readers information regarding the extraction of sand and in-filling at a site of 20.5 hectares at Galley Lane Farm, between Little Brickhill and Great Brickhill.

The application by S.E. Grundon Ltd., is to extract sand, 80,000 to 100,000 tonnes per annum and infill with commercial waste. The scheme would operate for a period of twenty years.

There are obvious environmental consequences for villages in the immediate vicinity, not only the spoiling of the countryside, but also the number of heavy lorries carrying sand and unpleasant waste through villages like our own.

Despite the forthcoming bypass developments, an increase in traffic must have a significant effect on all local roads.

The Bucks County Council minerals plan indicates that a site of this size will attract approximately 140 vehicle movements each day, 50 of which relate to sand extraction, and 90 of which relate to waste disposal.

We are therefore asked to lend support to the "Save the Brickhills" campaign, and letters resisting the application should now be addressed to C.E. Schoon Esq., County Planning Officer, Bucks County Council, County Hall, Aylesbury HP20 1VY.

The planning application has been turned down by the District Council, but the County Council have still to make a decision.
