



We are interested to see that Bucks County Council have issued a very informative series of papers on "Waste and Recycling in Bucking-hamshire." The guide gives our waste collection Authority's telephone number, Aylesbury 395900, together with suggestions of what to do with old paint stripper, engine oil, old clothing, bric-a-brac, paper, metal, glass, plastic, and many other items. Their advice on cutting down the enormous amount of waste each household creates (about one tonne of rubbish every year!) is very sound.

- 1. Think about what you buy is it over packaged?
- 2. Look at what you throw away can it be re-used at home or at school
- 3. Can someone else make use of your waste charity shops and jumble sales can often make money from items you no longer want.
- 4. Only buy goods packaged in returnable containers if you intend to return them.
- 5. Use recycling facilities, but try not to make a special journey.
- 6. Help to create a demand by purchasing goods made from recycled
