WHAT IS ALPHA?

LETTER FROM VIETMAN FROM STEVEN SWAN

Remember me? The lad, who some months ago was trying to raise £3000 to fund his place on a voluntary conservation expedition to the rain forests of northern Vietnam? Well now I'm sitting in some primary Montane rain forest in the very north of Vietnam and this is my field report for the Soulbury Village Newsletter and all those from Soulbury who generously supported my fund raising attempts. I must confess this brief report is a little late for the expedition I was raising all that money, for the expedition is now over. Yet as I have just mentioned I'm still in the forest. This is because I'm now on my second expedition with Frontier, only this time as a member of staff! As Assistant Research Co-ordinator, I am principally responsible for the biological science programme conducted during the expedition. I also help run the expedition in general and look after the new lot of volunteers, just as I was looked after on the last expedition which was, by the way, a great success. We caught many rare and endangered butterfly, moth, frog, toad and bat. We saw tremendous birds and were fortunate enough to witness what was probably the greatest migration of raptors (birds of prey) ever recorded in Vietnam! Literally thousands of falcons, harriers, buzzards and eagles flew straight over our camp! A camp which has its fair share of floods, fires and winds strong enough to 'lift' our long-house sleeping quarters off the hill side and down on to our expedition leader's head! So far this expedition is going well also.

VALE VOLUNTEERS

In the Aylesbury Vale area there are now over 170 groups looking for help from people of all ages and from all walks of life. For instance Bucks County Library Service needs help for its Housebound Library Service. A regular library user might feel able to collect books for someone who is unable to get out of the house.

Dog Lovers who are at home most of the time might like to become a puppy socialiser for the Hearing Dogs for Deaf People Scheme. Food costs and vet bills are paid by the organisation for about six months while the puppy gets used to family life.

Even busy people can often find a half hour to drop into see someone who is lonely or housebound. Or those with a bit more time might drive, or work in a school, hospital or home, doing office or reception duties or helping where the need is greatest.
