# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The clerk has received one quotation for revitalising the engraving on the war memorial of around £1500 but another has yet to be sought. There appears to be a shortage of firms prepared to do this work.

It was agreed that the 'Perfect Village Sunday' was as successful as weather allowed, and letters of thanks would be sent to the A.V.D.C. for the provision of the music from the sliver band and the Punch and Judy show. Also it was agreed to send a donation to Stewkley Scouts who loaned us the tents, and helped erect them. These turned out to be essential for the day.

Regarding the children's playground, it was noted how the litter was building up, and a new person to keep an eye on the area, is desperately needed. A source of top soil is being sought, as the original offer had fallen through, this is to be used to try to level off the football area, and it was agreed to try to keep the grass somewhat shorter during the summer as that is the time of maximum usage.

It was very disappointing to hear that the grant application for a completely new play area and bike track, has been refused. However, a much reduced scheme may be a possibility with the assistance of A.V.D.C. and local fundraising. Mrs Jackie Ridley is looking into this.

The hedge and verge along the High Road outside the children's playground is very overgrown again, and that will be cut back as soon as possible. (Thank you Jon for doing it so quickly)

The design of the tarmacadam footpath leading into the Millennium Green is a disaster for many users of wheels and also most pedestrians. Bucks County Council will be asked to make this safer and more user friendly.

Mrs Margaret White reported that she had taken a place on the newly set up Rural Tenants' Panel and she includes this letter:

The new Rural Tenants' Panel is now 'up and running'. A meeting is held once a month in Aylesbury with A.V.D.C. members at the meetings. Mrs Margaret White, 10 High Road, Soulbury is your 'Panel Member'. If you have anything to say, please let her know and it would be mentioned at the meeting, especially if you are a council tenant, but do not think for 1 minute that private owners and occupiers in the parish would not be listened to.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on July 16<sup>th</sup>.


