# MILLENNIUM GREEN TRUST

The Annual General meeting of the Millennium Green Trust was held on Thursday June 19th in the Club Room. There were five Trustees present and two members of the public.

In general, things are going well on the Green. The trees are flourishing and the environment, plant and bird life is diversifying and maturing. However, the Treasurer expressed his concerns over the financial state of the Trust in future The bank balance is healthy at the moment, but

grant money from environmental organisations such as The Countryside Agency had now come to an end. Insurance costs have risen astronomically and the Trust will need to raise over £1000 a year in order to break even and ensure The Green is maintained properly. The Chairman recognised the importance of the Treasurer's views and said that fund raising should be a priority in the next few years.

also expressed some disappointment that the Green, especially the amphitheatre, is not used enough by the local community for events. She said that promotion of The Green to the wider public for drama. musical events, to W.I.'s, OAPS, to playgroups, for barbecues picnics. should be something the Trust would concentrate on in the future. The Green is there to be used by everyone, so if any group or individuals would like to use The Green for any function. please contact the Secretary on 270514 and your ideas will surely be welcomed.

The question of an electricity supply on The Green was discussed again and this project is making progress slowly. It is hoped that The Green will be more attractive to local groups for functions if electricity is available.

The meeting ended with the Chairman thanking everyone for all their hard work and support over the last year and expressing regret that Mrs Maureen Payne, a long time supporter, Trustee and ex-Chairman of the MG, is leaving. After the AGM there followed ordinary meeting when arrangements for the Ramble and Barbecue on Sunday July 20th were discussed at length. Offers of help will be much appreciated.
