JUBILEE FOUNTAIN : Further progress was made on Saturday 19th June in tidying the fountain, thanks to Daniel Axtell-Powell, Jim Cochrane and Vic Wright. They organised and laid weed control matting and gravel around and to the front of the fountain in order to reduce the overgrowth of weeds and grass, creating a clean foreground which shows off the fountain perfectly.

Our next working group is planned for Saturday 24th July, at 10am at the fountain, where we will aim to clear some of the horsetail surrounding the sump to the back of the fountain and try to repair the water system. If you can spare 1-2 hours at the end of July to help, this would be greatly appreciated.

TRAVELLING HEROES

Travelling Heroes: A talk by Robin Lane Fox on Wednesday 14th July 2010 at 6:30 pm, St Columba's Church, Pont Street, London SW1X 0BD. In aid of All Saints Church, Soulbury.

If you [Google Robin Lane Fox](#) you are faced with several choices: gardener, historian, classicist, film star, expert on Alexander the Great, lecturer on pagans and Christians, Oxford don, and so it goes on. This coming autumn the BBC will broadcast a series of television programmes based on his latest book 'Travelling Heroes' which transports us back to the epic age of Homer. The talk is bound to be lively, informal and hilarious. With wit, charm and erudition Robin Lane Fox will tell us of his Travelling Heroes as he confides: 'I continue to wish to revisit the Greek world of the eighth century BC'. In Homer's Iliad the goddess Hera flies across to Mount Olympus and is compared to a particular movement of the human mind: 'When a man has travelled far and wide, his mind will sometimes leap and he will think 'I wish I was here, or I wish I was there as he longs for many different things'. Robin describes a magical trail of travel and myth across the Mediterranean. His book touches on the deprivations of that era (no sugar, no chocolate, no pians, a world of intense smell and pain) but the compensations are many. We go from Syria to the Bay of Naples; to Sicily and Cyprus; Crete and Egypt. Fact and fiction seem to meet: the past and the present are fused as he compares the Cilician plain in Turkey where horses now graze to those same flatlands from which King Solomon imported horses into Israel in the 10th century BC... similarly the latter-day sailor has to navigate by the same fierce easterly winds as those known to Greek cargo ships in days gone by, on their way home from the Holy Land. He could be writing his own book review when he says of Homer's travellers that they 'captivate and draw us back to this particular era and culture and an unsurpassed age of poetry' and that... 'nothing prepares us for this dazzling achievement.' Robin Lane Fox, like the Greeks of the eighth century, is 'distinguished for words rather than things.'
