Soulbury Chapel. Following im registration in 1838 we next glimpse the rinancial records for 1859, shewing an income for the year of £5.6s.; seat rents amounted to \$4.12s.6d and the cost of heating and lighting was £1.6s. There was a debt of £50, presumably from the fullding Fund. A Suhday School record for 1860 shews that there were 79 scholars with an average attendance of 55 children, and 17% Sunday School teachers, the annual cost for running the school was £2.2s.8½d. The addition of the gallery in 1866 increased the seating capacity by 50 to 148 seats, calculated at an allowance of 20½ in hes per person. 92 seats were for letting, 30 were free and 26 were for schoolchildren. A Property Schedule for 1872 gives the estimated value of the building as £288 and reveals that the Treasurer was a Mr. Preswell. A membership record for 1914 may be of interest to people still living in Soulbury; E. Dickens, J. Cater, J. Mead, F. Tearle, E. Spratt, Geo. Scott, Hy. Conquest, Wm. Turner, T. Mead, Emma Cater, Emma Turney, Lizzie Turney, Erma Faulkner, Winnie Robinson, Violet Smith, Lily Flavel, Lessie Arnold and Emma Chappel. On 23rd December, 1934 the preacher at the evening service was our own Mr. H. Scott who has been a lay preacher since 1925.
