Soulbury Playground Progress Report.

1. There has been a delay in commencement of work, whilst written assurance of the absence of cables, pipes etc has been obtained from the various public utilities.
2. At the beginning of June the Community Work Team intend to improve the 'flatness' of the mown area by adding topsoil as required, and erect goal posts and a netball post. They will also re-fix the fencing if the supplier has not returned to so do beforehand. Mr. Giles, the Community Work Programme Organiser, has especially asked that his team be allowed to work unhindered.
3. A four seat swing is to be ordered from Wickstead Leisure Ltd., at a cost of nearly £600. There will be three flat seats and one child's 'cradle' seat. It is hoped to site a bench nearby and that this, together with other equipment, will be made by volunteers from telegraph timber obtained at low cost from British Telecom.
