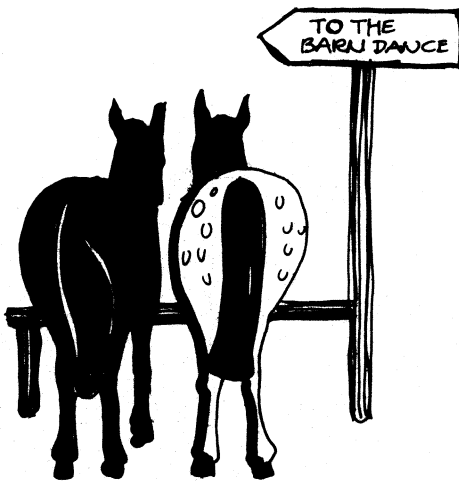


PARISH COUNCIL

At the Annual Parish Meeting the Chairman Mr. Alf Peacock reviewed the activities of the Parish Council over the past year. He was particularly concerned that the public should be aware of the amount of work undertaken by the Council and especially the clerk - Mrs. Pat Salzedo - and thanked her for her dedicated services. Often this work was really the responsibility of the District Council. The maintenance of roadways and repairs to footpaths is not part of the Parish Councils' work, but it would help when trying to ensure that damage is adequately repaired if parishioners would take a note of the date when holes or ditches are dug, and the name of the party responsible, particularly on property nearby, and inform either Mr. Peacock or the Parish Clerk (L.B. 371126). It was also reported that planning permission has been granted for the clubroom extension so it is hoped that if enough money has been raised by later on this summer, work can commence then.



The next Parish Council meeting is on 11th June, when an item on the agenda will be the application for permission to extract sand/gravel from Rislip Farm. This will no doubt be of interest to many Parishioners so the plans, and some Councillors, will be present in the Clubroom at 7.30 p.m. on that evening, to allow discussion before any decisions are taken.
