he result of the public consultation exercise which was undertaken by the District & County Councils have been published. About 32,000 replies were received from nearly half a million questionnaires. 60% chose option C which was for four unitary council areas, but the County Council feels that the unlawful advice given by Environment Secretary John Gummer persuaded people that the status-quo could not be considered one of the options. The second choice for most people seems to be to create two unitary authorities, that is Milton Keynes and the rest of Buckinghamshire. This option would certainly cause the least upheaval and damage to existing services, and cost less than the fragmentation into smaller local councils, but would not perhaps reflect local interest and identities so well. The next stage is further consultation! The commission will publish its draft proposals for Buckinghamshire in late June & everyone will be asked to comment on these.

We are sorry to hear of the recent death of Mrs Eva Sawyer. Although lately in a home in Luton Mrs Sawyer will be remembered by many as she lived and worked in Soulbury most of her life. She was also a keen supporter of the Salvation Army. We extend our sympathy to her son and daughters.
