ANNUAL PARISH MEETING REPORT

The Annual Meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday 15th May. Mr Alf Peacock, as Chairman, made a brief report about the Council's activities in the past year including the successful Centenary celebrations; maintaining satisfactory street lighting; opposing planning applications which would change the character of the village and its surroundings. It was also noted that there was very little change in the Parish Council's financial position or in progress on the by-pass. The Chairman referred to the formation of the Friends of Soulbury Church and its fundraising efforts including now undertaking the village grass cutting. Further reports by the councillors were then given as follows:

The Village Hall committee is now proposing to replace windows in the kitchen and the toilets. The Environment Group urgently need new members. The work on the bottom half of the Church wall could be completed within the next 6 weeks. Volunteers will be needed again to help with the demolition work. There are still problems with dogs fouling the playground and the Parish Council is at great pains to ensure that there is no dangerous equipment there.

There followed a public discussion which covered the efforts of the Council to achieve an additional footpath in Andrews Close; the attempt to limit horse riding on the Green to a strip on each side of the road; a report for a further speeding check in the village and monitoring of heavy lorries. A VILLAGER WRITES

On the 15th May the Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Clubroom, preceded by one of the Parish Council Meetings which are held regularly throughout the year. This Annual Meeting is the occasion on which the Councillors report to the general public on their stewardship during the year just past, of all aspects of the manifold tasks they undertake on our behalf. It is perhaps not generally appreciated that all the members of the council not only attend Council Meetings, but each individually undertakes responsibility for some area or areas of village concerns: - planning applications, playground, footpaths,

lighting, the clubroom, the environment, site meetings, grass cutting, liaison with other parishes, etc.etc. All this entails considerable outlay of their time and effort - all without any payment whatsoever.

In view of this it seems to be a great pity that only TWO members of the general public attended the Annual Parish Meeting to take an interest in all this work and to show the Council that their efforts on our behalf are appreciated.

It is said that a people gets the government it deserves. It seems to the writer that in Soulbury we get far more and better than we deserve!

VILLAGE POLICING

At the recent Annual Parish Meeting a report was read from WPC Furber. This gave statistics of crime in the village during the past year and stressed the importance of the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in making the village as secure as possible.

During the past year a total of 35 crimes were reported. Of this total there were: 6 thefts of motor vehicles; 2 attempted thefts; 11 thefts from motor vehicles; 4 dwelling burglaries; 4 non-dwelling burglaries and 5 thefts.

Generally, car related crimes and the non dwelling burglaries occurred overnight in locations which were not overlooked or well lit. Car alarms are a worthwhile investment in such locations.

During WPC Furber's absence from patrol work there will still be a Police presence. Sergeant Tim Davis is responsible for day to day policing of the Rural Section, along with area beat officers PC's Ellis, Hawkins and Brigginshaw. It is hoped that as many parishioners' as possible will attend the Neighbourhood Watch Meeting on Wednesday May 31st.
