### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

There was a short Parish Council meeting before the Annual Meeting held on 18th May, at which it was agreed to put up some small notices to help keep horse riders to the edge of The Green. A subcommittee would also look into some environmental improvements especially concerning the expansion and maintenance of the roadways across The Green.

The hole in the corner of the children's playground had been filled in and the fence would be repaired very shortly.

A letter had been received from A.V.D.C. stating that the Stewkley Road would be repaired before April 1999, also information was included on the summer entertainment for children which will be on Tuesday August 18th in the clubroom at 11:00am.

County Councillor Jennings recommended that an officer of the Highways Department should come to a Parish Council meeting to hear the concerns of Soulbury residents about the roads and traffic problems and to try to help the situation. It was agreed to follow this through.

It was reported that Bucks County Council had received more money to spend on rural transport, which would be welcome.

The next two meetings were arranged for Monday 29th June and Tuesday 28th July.

### **ANNUAL PARISH MEETING**

The complete set of minutes for the Annual Meeting, compiled by the Clerk, will be available to any interested parties later in the month. These should be on display in the Clubroom, the Church and the Chapel Schoolroom.

The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming the four parishioners who had taken the trouble to attend and also County Councillor Jennings. It was regretted that PC Griggs was not present. He went on to individually thank each member of the Parish Council, and described a number of activities and expectations which the Council had fulfilled over the year.

County Councillor Jennings then reported on the changes and concerns which had taken her attention over the last twelve months. Education initiatives had been important; the places for 4 year olds, the bringing forward of secondary education for 11 year olds and the Education for Life scheme which was a new project to encourage further education for all. She voiced her concern particularly about the expansion of Milton Keynes, and said she would be fighting the proposition on our behalf. She felt that the best way forward was to make use of the 'brown-field' sites within the present boundaries, even if this did mean that construction was more dense. The Chairman thanked Mrs Jennings on our behalf for her efforts.

District Councillor Maureen Payne said that the wheelie bins were coming a little later than anticipated as there had been some problems with them in Aylesbury. In the Parishes Review it had been agreed that Soulbury's boundaries would remain as they were. The second year of the competition - the Ted Payne Memorial Pub Quiz - was just about to commence. The Chairman thanked Councillor Payne for representing Soulbury so well.

The representative from Liscombe Park Mr Nigel Smith was then invited to speak. He talked of the Golf Course proposals and promised that due consideration would be paid to the environmental concerns and that the footpaths would be left more or less as they are and the fairways and greens arranged around them. There was also a proposal by Liscombe Park to construct a bridle path on the north side of the estate to link with Rock Lane and Stoke Hammond bridle ways. This was felt to be a very welcome initiative. Mr Smith apologised on behalf of the Estate for the inconvenience which walkers had suffered over the use of tanks on the property. He said that improvements to the footpaths were already in place and that the problem should be alleviated before too long. The stick and ball areas were polo practice fields and the polo pitches themselves would only be used about six times a year, including charity events.

Councillor Luther Brazier then spoke of the Millennium Green. The proposal has passed the Countryside Commissions requirements, and we were waiting to hear from the Millennium Commission (we have since heard that they have accepted our application!). The first instalment of the grant together with some funding from the Parish Council would be paid to the field owner over the next six weeks to complete the sale of the land. The Charitable Trust could be soon set up and various legalities settled. The meeting voted to accept the Millennium proposal and also the funding package. Councillor Luther Brazier was again thanked heartily for all his efforts.

Members of the public then spoke. A concern was expressed over the dangerous double parking at the top of Chapel Hill. As PC Griggs was not present the Clerk agreed to contact him on the matter. Thanks were proposed to the Chairman and all the councillors for their year's work and also to Mr Luther Brazier for duplicating the newsletter each month.

### **MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS**

We have now received the acceptance of our plans and the grant is definitely forthcoming. A cause for celebration and also the start of the work to create this exciting place. Mr Luther Brazier wants to thank all the steering group members who have brought us to this stage; they were Alf Peacock, Stan Morris, John Spires, Liz Miller and Jane Phillpot, with consultants Richard Onslow and Jonathan Sheppard. The responsibility now is with the Trustees to take us forward. They are Maureen Payne (Chairman), Julie Day (treasurer), Jane Phillpot (secretary), Christine Sheppard, Richard Marks and Liz Miller.

Whilst we are waiting for the first portion of the grant to come through, members of the village might consider how they could assist in the creation of the Green. There will be a 'welcome to this space' on the evening of 15th July when everyone can walk around the field and appreciate what we have bought and what we plan to do with it. The Trustees will enjoy meeting as many members of the village as are able to attend. More news next month.



At the Annual parish council meeting, about 12 months ago it was proposed for Soulbury to buy some land in the village and create a 'millennium green' an area of land which would belong to the people of "Soulbury" for their enjoyment and recreation. Since then a vast amount of time and effort has been spent trying to achieve this

The Parish News Letter has been used to give an up-date and convey any information on the Millennium Green's progress, but, as you showed your interest and took the time to come and support our efforts by attending the Exhibitions we, the Soulbury Millennium Green Trustees would personally like to tell you the good news:-

All the hard work has fared us well, our village has been successful in obtaining the Countryside Commissions approval for funding, we are now able to purchase the field proposed for the Millennium Green. This means by the end of July/August 1998 we the Soulbury parishioners, will own land which can be protected and preserved against any marauding developers and the on-going expansion programs of Milton Keynes, which are now threatening the boundaries of our Stoke Hammond and Newton Longville neighbours.

Once the field becomes legally ours, work will start on its transformation and we will be calling for all volunteers and persons wishing to help to come forward. There is a program of the various stages of development which will call for different labour skills, activity and equipment. Mrs liz Miller will be co-ordinating the fields physical aspect and development.

As from now, the Soulbury Millennium Green will come under the protection of a Trust, and be known as *Soulbury Millennium Green Trust*. The following people have become trustees: – Mrs Maureen Payne, (270418) Mrs Julie Day, (270036) Jane Phillpot, (270532) Mrs Liz Miller, (270545) Mrs christeine Sheppard, (270377) and Mr Richard Marks, (270687).

Initially, Soulbury Millennium Green will have to be financed through sponsorship from 'generous' local trades people and companies. Our own openhandedness in supporting fund raising events will all help. Donations and a contributions of funds, labour and equipment have been made by a few in the parish, but we are hoping for a much bigger response once on site work begins, hopefully all in the village will come and see whats going on and in some way or another, want to take part in the greens creation. Corporate funding from the bigger boys, and environmental fun holding agencies has been requested and we are hoping for a favourable response from some if not all of them.

Soulbury Millennium Green Trust wish to thank you personally for your encouragement and ask for your support to be ongoing so we can fulfil the aspirations set out at the exhibitions, hopefully in time for the 2000year celebrations.
