Concessionary Travel.

It is again time to apply for Bus Permits or Railcards for women of 60 and over and men of 65 and over.

The choice is for either a Bus Permit costing £3 (£1.50 if issued after 1st October, 1984) which will entitle the holder to half-fare travel on buses on any day, for journeys commencing or terminating in Buckinghamshire, excluding the area of Milton Keynes, OR a Railcard (normal price £12) for a charge of 50p. only, which will entitle the holder to purchase Single Ordinary Return and Awayday railway tickets at half the Adult fare.

Permits may be obtained from the Council Offices at Aylesbury, Buckingham or Winslow, but once again Mrs. Jones is offering to collect Permits or Railcards for anyone who so desires. For instance, did you know that you should not stand with your back to a window when communicating with deaf people as the light coming from behind you will cast shadows on your face and make it impossible for them to lip-read?
