

VILLAGE PROJECTS FUND

Buckinghamshire Council for Voluntary Service is now awaiting the first applications to its Village Projects Fund. Up until now the B.C.V.S. has been able to supply advice and support to groups starting new projects, the Village Projects Fund will enable them to give small grants to help get worthwhile initiatives off the ground. To qualify for funding the project must:- be for the benefit of a rural community, show evidence of interest of local people and have a commitment to raise money locally. Grants will not normally exceed £100 but it is hoped this will provide the necessary finance to allow the project to happen.
