This month there is to be a Flower Festival in the church and a Music Recital as part of a drive to raise the large sum of money which will be needed for church repairs. We thought that this month, therefore we would give a few points of interest about the church.

There is now nothing remaining of the building which must have been there in 1231 when the first rector of whom we know was appointed. The oldest extensive part of the present structure was built in the second quarter of the fourteenth century, at the beginning of the Hundred Years War; further additions were made later in that century and minor alterations were made in the fifteenth. There was major rebuilding in Tudor times when the aisles were extended and the tower added.

Some of the things to look for inside the church are the monument confidently ascribed to Grinling Gibbons, the doorway which used to give access to the rood loft, monuments to various members of the Lovett family who held the manor for over six hundred years, the padlocked chest and the little wooden angels appearing down the length of the Tudor roof. Two of the angels hold shields having the initials R H. These, almost certainly, are the initials of Robert Hobbes. Abbot of Woburn from 1529 to 1538 and therefore at that time ex-officio Vicar of Soulbury. Hobbes was one of the few who dared to oppose Henry the Eighth and suffered the usual fate of those who opposed the royal will. He was hanged on an oak tree at the gate of his own abbey which in the following year was confiscated and given to the Russell family. There is a board at the back of the church which gives the name of all the incumbents from that rector in 1231 to the present time.

In the course of the Festival a leaflet will be on sale which will give much more fascinating detail about the church.
