At the Annual Parish Meeting the lease was duly signed. The first objectives are to clean the site and erect fencing. The Parish Council expressed the hope that once the ground was in use parents would co-operate with members of the Play Ground Committee in seeing that children enjoy its amenities whilst respecting the rights of those living in the vicinity and maintaining the ground in a good condition.

Annual Parish Meeting.

There were about a dozen members of the public present at the meeting to hear the Council report on the various business affairs of the Parish and the state of sundry parish accounts.

Particular topics raised were the condition of The Green, the possible marking of bridle paths, in particular between the village and the Three Locks, the trimming of

the hedge and clearance of excess water in the High Road.

In addition, Councillor Reg Keen spoke of the proposed Wing/Milton Keynes relief road and said that a public announcement would be made shortly of possible routes. He suggested that a committee of all the affected villages might then be formed to discuss the effect of the num erous proposals on the whole area. He was still pressing for a weight restriction on the Wing/Soulbury/Three Locks road. A decision about this would be made shortly.

Collection for National Children's Homes.

The total of this house-to-house collection was £44.82 and this sum has now been forwarded. All those who contributed are thanked and in particular Miss Jayne Norman, Mrs.M.Rowe, Mrs.P. Norman and Mrs. G. Kirk, who did the collecting.
