PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the recent meeting the Council were pleased to note that the Aylesbury Planning Officers had acted on their suggestions and comments regarding the Brook Cottages development, and the finished buildings now conformed to their expectations. Anglian Water has finally re-instated The Green, and the area around the salt bin is certainly tidier. Time will tell if the seeding has been successful. Eastern Electricity has contacted the Council announcing a seven per cent cut in street lighting charges. A welcome surprise.

A.V.D.C. also introduced the possibility of Soulbury hosting a 'Perfect Village Sunday' when a silver band and a Punch and Judy Show would be brought to entertain the public one summer Sunday afternoon. The village had to be able to offer a wet weather venue, as well as seating for outside, both of which were possible. The meeting agreed it was an excellent idea and would like to be put forward in the selection process. Only four villages in the Vale would be chosen.

Mr Stan Morris was keen to encourage more Neighbourhood Watch activity and was particularly interested in Soulbury joining up with a larger region so as to receive pertinent and up to date ideas, information and advice on criminal activity. He was hoping that an area administrator might be able to come to a village meeting before too long.

The Chairman, Mr Alf Peacock, brought forward the suggestion that we ask the County Highways Department for detailed information on traffic counts in the area. Following the receipt of this a traffic census organised by villagers might be set up during this summer. He was anxious to press for the village weight limit on the C20 road to be reduced to 7.5 tonnes, as there is now no need for larger vehicles to come through Soulbury to avoid the Wing Road railway bridge. Those vehicles can now use the Leighton southern by-pass.

A reminder was given that the next meeting was on Tuesday, 20th May at 7:00pm. Members of the village are cordially invited to attend the Annual Parish meeting which will take place at 8:00pm on that Tuesday, 20th May, in the Clubroom.


