The weather was great, and people sat about on the grass or on benches or chairs provided by the Miller family. Many thanks are due to Sam Stevens. particularly organising it all, and her husband Richard (not Alan as printed in the Observer my fault - apologies Richard). This is the first time the Millennium Green Trust has tried this event and it is hoped that it will become a tradition in future years and that even more children and adults will join in next year. It's a free community event and is just the kind of thing the Trustees are keen to encourage.

ALL SAINTS CHURCH

Holy Week and Easter Sunday Services were well

attended. About 50 people were in the church on Easter for а joyful Sunday celebration. Maundy On Thursday, there was a Said Eucharist at 7.30pm attended by a handful of people, 7 or 8. and on Good Friday we had a meditation and the 14 stations of the Cross at 11 o'clock in the morning. It was sad time for auiet. reflection on the mystery of the Easter story.

The Parochial Church Council held a meeting in the church on Tuesday 22nd April to discuss the following items: the heating system, church cleaning, new carpet, yew trees and the broken down fence between the churchyard and Church Paddock.

Chris Churchwarden, Mr Bryant, has produced a detailed plan of the proposed heating system. He explained that it was a powerful system, similar to the one in All Saints Church in Wing, that it had two boilers and a 7 day time switch and he showed where the radiators, which would be painted a discreet brown colour. would be positioned. It was agreed by everyone present that this proposal should be adopted. Since the Diocesan authorities have also agreed to this proposed system it was decided to proceed and seek three tenders, as is customary, so that if all goes according to plan it is hoped the system will be up and running by next winter.

As most people will already know, the blue carpet round the altar and chancel has been taken up and removed to reveal some forgotten Victorian floor tiles. They are especially attractive so it has been decided to keep them uncovered. However, there is to be a new carpet, very kindly donated by Gwyneth Gauntlett, in the nave, a dark red one, to be laid shortly by John Lewis in time for the grand wedding on Saturday 17th May at 2pm of Gwyneth and her partner Maurice Hawkins. both recently arrived in the village and living in Dean Farm Lane.

Since the church now has a kitchen and a toilet and these floor tiles that need cleaning. it was decided to advertise in this newsletter for a cleaner. In spite of a great deal of time and effort on the part of the vicar, the churchwardens and the secretary, the PCC has been unable to determine the ownership of the fence which is leaning at a 45° angle and needs repairing and goes along the edge of the churchvard on the south A meeting is to be side. called shortly for all interested parties to attend when it is hoped satisfactory solution can be arrived at.
