## PARISH COUNCIL

**Speeding** : The Parish Council are actively looking into purchasing a mobile speed device, this will be shared between four parishes and we will be offering people the chance to be trained to use it.

**Jubilee Fountain** : For the first time in many years the Victorian fountain on Leighton Road, Soulbury, has water spouting from the **lion's head**. It has been the wishes of residents of Soulbury Parish that restoration work should be undertaken to preserve this once functional working fountain. However, a feasibility study shows that the costs of such restoration are unrealistic currently. Instead, residents got to work on cutting down and clearing out years of overgrowth to expose the fountain. The original sump, which is fed by three natural springs, was located back in the field and a new pipe was laid to take the water from the sump to the fountain. The clean spring water now runs constantly into the trough below.

The fountain, which makes use of natural water springs, would have been the watering hole for horses, as they drew their loads up the hill on their way to Leighton. Then, a much needed resource. Today, it is a testament to land workers who used available resources at very little cost. Then and now, it is a monument to commemorate Queen Victoria's jubilee.

We should preserve this monument to the best of our ability. Restoration is not possible, but we can aim to keep the fountain clean and in working order. This is achievable, if anyone has a few hours on a Saturday morning, now and again to don their 'wellies' - bring a spade, fork or shears. Date of next workout is Saturday 8th May at 10:00 at the fountain, for turf laying and tidying up.

Thank you to the residents of Soulbury Parish who have worked on the fountain clean up to date. Also, thank you to Daniel Axtell-Powell and Vic Wright who have spent some cold, wet and muddy hours to get the water running again.
