

With the advent of the darker evenings the problems caused by car parking in Soulbury become more serious, particularly at and near the Chapel Hill road junction. We should remind readers that it is illegal to park within 25 yards of a road junction after dark, and illegal at any time to cause an obstruction. It is perhaps not always appreciated that the motorist's vision is considerably limited if he is forced to emerge from Chapel Hill without being able to take full advantage of the vision splay markings. Traffic coming from the right which has to pull out to pass cars parked beyond the white line is quite unable to see traffic approaching up the hill from the direction of the 'Boot'. We need hardly add that pavements must be left clear for pedestrians at all times. It is of course reasonable that those attending the Church or the Chapel should wish to park on the hill and we ask all others using the hill to bear their needs in mind.

Readers are also reminded that cars must not be driven over common land on the Green.
