For those who so wish the AVDC is prepared to remove garden refuse, provided it is contained in the Council's green refuse sacks which cost 20p each collected from Cambridge Street Depot or 35p each delivered.

We feel sure it is hardly necessary to add that plastic, polystyrene and other man-made synthetics must never be burned as they are highly toxic; and no one should ever light a fire on someone else's property without express permission.
