Parish Council News

The Parish Council has received complaints about the parking of cars, particularly in the area of the clubroom and at the bottom of Mount Pleasant. Most residents who do this frequently are considerate enough to leave to leave room for pedestrians with pushchairs, bicycles or a wheelchair, but some do not. So please think of other pedestrians and remind your visitors to do so.

The Clerk has received notice from Education Department reminding parents of the system for admitting young children to school. This was for children starting school or reception from September 2001 to August 2002; that is children born between 1 September 1996 and 31 August 1997. Children's Playground

The Parish Council also discussed the planned alterations to the playground in Mount Pleasant. There has been virtually no response to the request for those interested in making improvements and changes to contact Jackie Ridley. Those who did attend the meeting she called put forward two alternatives.

There would be a complete removal of all the existing play equipment and a new range of swings, slide and climbing equipment on a safety surface would replace this. This area would be suitable for 4 to 10 year olds.

The football area would be retained with the possibility of new goalposts.

Another area would be designated towards the High Road for other children's use. The alternatives here were for either a tarmacadam bike track or a multi-purpose hard play area which could be used for basketball (with posts provided), cycling, kicking a football on (possibly with a wall or barrier to kick against) or tennis (without a net).

The bike track would be a somewhat cheaper option and might leave money to upgrade the perimeter fencing also.

All present felt they wanted to do what most villagers would like and would use; but as there had been so little interest shown it would fall to the few people prepared to comment to make the decisions. Here is your opportunity! Please, if you have any views on which of the two choices you would like to see implemented contact Jackie Ridlev (270619),Catherine Fairbairn (270674) or any member of the Parish Council. This is an important opportunity to create an exciting new facility and we need to know which one would be most successful in our village.

All Saints' Church Bells

I have been asked by a number of people in Soulbury why they can sometimes hear the church bells ringing "at odd times".

The main purpose of ringing the bells is to summon villagers to church services on Sundays. The bells will ring for half an hour before the church service which is normally at 11.30. Bell ringing is a skill that has to be practised, and so we also have a regular practice night on Thursdays which starts at 7.30 and lasts until 9 pm. Anyone who would like to learn to ring the bells is very welcome to come along any Thursday evening; you do not have to attend church services regularly to be a bell ringer. Any teenagers who would like to ring would be particularly welcome young people learn much more quickly!

We also have a number of visiting bands from other churches who ask to ring our bells. By tradition such visitors are allowed to ring the bells for about an hour (normally ringing a quarter peal) and in return leave a donation to the church funds.

Finally once a year we will allow a visiting band to attempt a full peal on or close to All Saints' Day. A peal in the bell ringer's equivalent of the marathon and can only be achieved by the most competent ringers. By tradition a peal involves changing the order of the bells at least five thousand times without error. A peal never yet been successfully rung at Soulbury church - and the bells have been there for over five hundred years! The first peal attempt will take place this Saturday on November in the morning, and if successful will be achieved by lunch time. The ringers will be lead by Phil Dunn who is the district ringing master and who has gone out of his way to teach all eleven of the Soulbury band over the last three years. We wish Phil and his band the very best of luck in this historic peal attempt.

The Newsletter – a History (continued)

In June 1979 we learned that the threat of Wing airport, now called Hoggeston, was rearing its ugly head again after nine years. The Wing Airport Resistance Association was re-formed and villages and townships around Hoggeston organised themselves to raise money and publicise our cause, so as to be ready for action were it necessary. By October we were reporting that deputation of nearly two hundred local people has presented to Mrs Thatcher during her visit to the Milton Keynes area, a petition with 60,000 signatures against the siting of the third London Airport at either Hoggeston or Yardley Chase.

By January 1980 we were able to report with relief, albeit with sympathy for the people of Stansted, that a final decision had been made, and we were off the hook.

In the same issue we recorded that the indisposition of Mr Stan Andrews had caused the closure of Soulbury Post Office and the need for arrangements to be made for the collection of pensions and allowances elsewhere. This turned out to be the final demise of our Post Office.

In July 1980 Pat Twyman of the Traffic Sub-Committee was writing of heavy vehicles using our roads to bypass Linslade. He wrote that he and others were "horrified at the thought of waiting ten years or more for relief from this menace". That was over twenty years ago! By 1982 County Councillor Keen spoke at our Annual Parish Meeting of possible routes for the proposed Wing / Milton Keynes Relief Road, and suggested the formation of a committee of all the affected villages.


