HALLOWEEN PUMPKINS

There are usually plenty of pumpkins about at this time, as the children like them for making lanterns for the night of the 31st. Rather than throwing away the flesh that is cut out when making that ghastly face, why not turn it into a delicious pie. (You may have to end up buying two pumpkins if the discards are not enough.) Pumpkins will keep for ages if left on a dry shelf or window sill so if you have a glut from the garden you could even make this for Christmas. The recipe is for an 8" pie dish already lined with shortcrust pastry:-

FILLING: 12 oz mashed cooked pumpkin (you need approx 1\frac{1}{2} 1b.
raw pumpkin for 12 oz cooked : stew gently in a very little water
until tender - about 15 minutes, strain thoroughly and mash.)
4 oz soft brown sugar. I tablespoon thick honey. Grated rind
and juice of ½ lemon and ½ orange. 2 eggs (well beaten). Pinch
salt. I teaspoon ground cinnamon. ½ teaspoon ground ginger.
🏅 teaspoon ground nutmeg. 🏅 pint creamy milk. I oz chopped walnuts.
l oz halved walnuts.
Mix sugar, honey, fruit juices and spices together. Beat together eggs, milk and pumpkin, and add this to the sugar mixture with the

grated rinds and chopped walnuts. Pour the mixture into the pastry
case. Place the pie on a baking sheet and bake for 55-60 minutes
at Gas 5, 375°F or until a knife inserted comes out clean. Decorate
the warm pie with the halved walnuts, and serve hot or cold with
lots of whipped cream.
