


SOULBURY CHURCHYARD WALL


At last we can start work on the demolition of the Church wall, from the Memorial to the gate, to enable the County Highways department to put in a path. This will mean that crossing the road will be safer, and the wall itself will also be made safe.

In order to save money and time we are asking that volunteers come along between 10a.m. and 4p.m. on Sunday Oct. 2nd. when we are hoping that the wall can be taken down, and the bricks cleaned and stacked. Please bring your own tools. Even if you don't feel up to dealing with bricks, there's always a job for two people holding

the "stop and go" boards. The owners of Kirkview have kindly agreed to allow their piece of old wall also to be re-sited further back, enabling safer pedestrian access along that part of the footpath as well. That work should take place this month also.

AYLESBURY VALE COMMUNITY HEALTH COUNCIL: WORKING WITH THE COMMUNITY.

Aylesbury Vale Community Health Council (CHC for short) is the statutory body that represents and looks after the patient's and public's interest in the National Health Service in Aylesbury Vale. The CHC meets regularly with Buckinghamshire Health Authority to influence what health services are provided and assist in the assessment of local needs, and also meets with the Stoke Mandeville Hospital and Community Healthcare NHS trusts in Aylesbury. They also undertake a variety of projects and surveys aimed at improving healthcare in the district.

The CHC wants to hear the views and needs of the people of Aylesbury Vale in order to fully represent them, to those who organise our health care. The CHC is organising a series of meetings (Healthlinks) to listen to the views of local people about health services. A Healthlink will be held at Wing Village Hall on Thursday Nov 3rd. at 8p.m. The meeting is open to the public and if you would like to be included please go along.
