PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the Council meeting held recently it was noted with disappointment that P.C. Brigginshaw had been allocated a new locality, and although P.C. Mick Griggs will be made welcome, the Council felt this rapid changing of rural officers was very unsatisfactory. The Clerk will write to the Area Superintendent to make him aware of this. There was no police representative present at the meeting to comment.

Mr Bercow MP has taken a great interest in our village traffic problems and has written to Bucks County Council's Head of Transportation supporting our request for a 7.5 tonne weight limit. He also pressed them for specific estimates for repairing the Castle Hill Bridge in Wing as he felt this work should be carried out speedily, not waiting for a possible five years. It is likely that the local papers may well take up the cause also.

Mrs Miller reported that the owner of the site used by the car dismantlers at Hollingdon Depot had agreed to allow a hedge to be planted along the frontage, so long as he did not have to bear any costs. Although this was felt to be unsatisfactory, at least permission had been given and as the hedge was deemed a necessity, to act as a screen to try to improve the landscape here, it was agreed a grant should be sought to help with the costs. Volunteers would then be requested to plant the hedgerow in November.

When the subject of the children's Playground was raised Mr Cross agreed to make good the large hole that had appeared on the football area, and also agreed to repair the fence which had been damaged. Mrs Miller reported that several of the elm trees between the High Road and the playground fence had died and ought to be felled. The Council agreed that all along the road the hedge needed tidying, so this work should be carried out in the Autumn, after planning permission had been granted.

It was reported that the green sacks scheme, where by pensioners in the village were supplied with sacks for garden rubbish free of charge, had been running successfully now for over two years. Six hundred sacks had been distributed to the 30 or so pensioners who were making use of the facility. The sacks are currently 41p each but remain free to pensioners.

It was agreed to write to the organiser of the Mobile Library route to request that the library van should once again use Chapel Hill as its parking place. It was felt that the Bus Stop was really no safer and caused access problems for the users of the library.

Mr Brazier reported some progress on the Millennium Green project, but was awaiting replies to various requests for information.

The dates for the next three Parish Council meetings were fixed for Wednesday 15th October, Monday 17th November and Monday 15th December.

NEW HEDGEROW REGULATIONS

As from 1st June 1997 new rules have come into force governing the removal of hedgerows. "It is against the law to remove most countryside hedgerows without permission. To get permission to remove a hedgerow, you must write to your local planning authority. If the authority decide to prohibit removal of an important hedgerow, it must let you know within 6 weeks. If you remove a hedgerow without permission (whether it is important or not) you may face an unlimited fine. You may also have to replace the hedgerow." The way in which the regulations apply to individual hedgerows is quite complex so anyone with plans to remove a hedgerow is advised to consult informally with the A.V.D.C. planning department at an early stage.

We would like to welcome Tony and Lady Rose Saint who have recently come to live at The Boot.


FAREWELL

AGES OF TRANSFER IN BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

From 1st September 1999, pupils in LEA, Voluntary and GM schools in Aylesbury Vale will transfer at the age of 7 years from First to Middle Schools and at 11 years from Middle and Combined Schools to Secondary Schools.

Some schools will continue to admit children at the same ages as currently being admitted but this does not preclude parental choice for those who may wish to transfer their children to the feeder schools which will be taking children a year earlier.
