Harvest Festival, celebrated on Sunday 19th September, was a very happy occasion. The church was decorated with lovely fruit, flowers and vegetables and it made a colourful setting for the baptism of little Grace Lily Dethick from Chelmscote who was welcomed into the fellowship of the Christian church by the rest of the congregation and the Rev Peter Lymbery who conducted the service. There were about 70 people in church; it was good to have so many.

It was a historic occasion because the newly installed heating was switched on for the first time and certainly added considerably to the warm and friendly atmosphere. At the end of the Harvest Festival Service, all the produce was taken to the Club Room in preparation for the Harvest Supper and auction on Monday September 20th at 7:30pm. Now that he is the Reverend John Hibbard, we hope to see him more often, though he will be based in Stewkley primarily. They are non-stipendiary ministers which means they do all their work voluntarily and out of love and a sense of duty.

At the meeting held on 27th September, Vic Wright took the chair and thanked the other councilors for electing him Chairman. Five councilors and two members of the public attended the meeting.

Cedar Lodge, 16 The Green: An application to demolish the present garage and erect a replacement was discussed. The Clerk was requested to write to AVDC requesting that the application be approved only with the condition that the garage building cannot be sold separately from the house on the site.

The Children's Playground: It has been established that the swings can be refurbished. Quotes are awaited for the ground under the swings to be leveled and a protective synthetic material to be installed. Unfortunately the slide has to be demolished for safety reasons.

Clubroc. The kitchen window was vandalized and has now been repaired. Everyone is requested to report any future suspicious behavior to the police or any of the parish councilors.
