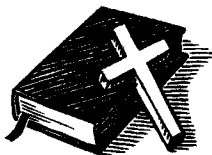

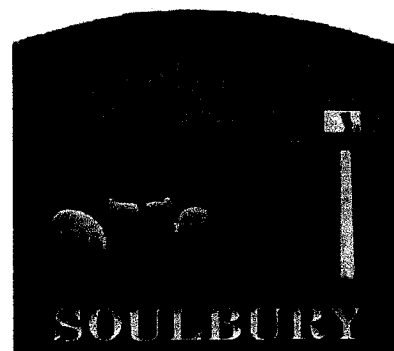

CHURCH NEWS

Harvest Festival: The village Harvest Festival, held in the church on Sunday September 21st was well supported. The church looked a picture, decorated as it was with so many colourful vegetables, fruit and flowers. There were bright yellow sunflowers and chrysanthemums, deep red and purple dahlias, scarlet apples, stripy marrows, tomatoes and peppers, decorative hops and trailing crimson Virginia creeper. Many thanks to everyone who gave gifts of produce, to those who decorated the font, the pulpit and the window ledges, to the refreshment ladies, to Andrew Berry who played the organ, to the Rev. Michelle Morton who conducted a truly thanksgiving service and to everyone who came along.

Harvest Supper: A good time was had by all at the Harvest Supper, which took place in the newly renovated Clubroom, with the usual high standard of food provided by Margaret Rowe with help from the WI. Harvest produce was auctioned by John Rowe and Chris Bryant and the total sum of £440 was raised for the Church funds. The raffle raised £103 which is to be sent to the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution - the charity that assists the farming community.
